Now Lizzie, I don't want you to spend too much time casting shy glances around the room. I want you to <u>study your lessons</u>. I reckoned when I left you would be flirting with my boy. Well I will se to things when I come home. ha ha. Oh I would like to see you. Won't we have a good time. You have got to come and stay a week at a time

I suppose the choir is prospering finely. How I would like to go and hear it. They have a lovely Cathedral in **Marquette**. When we go home I want to go inside. As we stay with a Catholic lady, I shall have a chance to go. It is the loveliest building I ever saw and they say it is just as nice inside. I suppose Mass will be celebrated in **Berlin** Christmas as it always is. Give my respects to Father Caldwell, when you see him and Minnie Brown has moved to Detroit.
