You ought to have been to the dance last Friday. I had a lovely time. There was about sixty two numbers out.

Did you have a nice time to Muskegon? Say you ought to have seen me yesterday. I rode the plough all day. I can hardly sit down now.

I will add a couple of dozen of bottles to your drug store when I come to live with you.
