Paper: Lined paper 5" wide by "7-7/8" high. Envelope addressed to Mrs Wm Fitzpatrick, City.

The front of the envelope was postmarked Dennison, Feb. 1898

The envelope is stamped with a 1-cent stamp

The envelope is 6 "wide by 3-5/8" high

The last week has been so terrible, I could do nothing about social. If the roads are better, I will come up to see you some night this week. So we can talk over matters and make arrangements.

Ask everybody you see to attend with a well filled pocket book. i.e. the boy. Girls with a well filled lunch box.

Write me by return mail, that I may know whether to proceed with announcements. Want to send some invitations to Advent and wonder if **Mart** could get a load from Herrington, and Etta Fitz. from her school.
