
Letter: One page both sides

Paper: Lined paper: 10-1/8" wide by 7-5/8" high

It looks like Lizzie Hoban drew a picture of a small lady in the very top right hand corner of the first page of the letter. It appears she was drawing a stamp. She wrote the words 2 cents around the picture. Underneath the picture she wrote the word "laugh"
