There was a lady married up the **Heights** yesterday afternoon and they called me in after work and treated me to all the good things connected with the wedding but could not kiss the bride as she had gone to Chicago on their wedding trip (too bad wasn't it).

Have you been to C'Ville since the fourth? I haven't heard a word from there since I came back. It was too bad you couldn't have stayed there and seen a good balloon ascension. The first thing I heard when I got back here was what I missed by going away. Some of my friends had a picnic down to the Lake and they must of missed me terribly. Don't you think so? But I tell you, I wasn't sorry I came home. (Be it ever so humble, there is no place like home).
